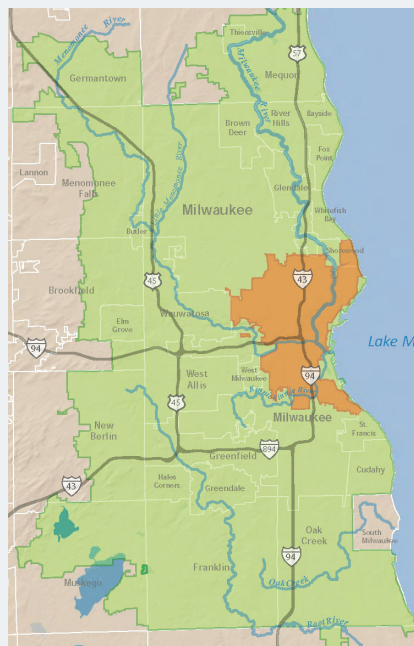
Amount to be financed: US\$20,000,000

The Project: Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) is working with a team led by Corvias to implement widespread green infrastructure (GI) across a 28-community region. Corvias will introduce project delivery efficiencies into the GI development process, thereby saving money and protecting water resources. GI includes but is not limited to green roofs, rain barrels and cisterns, porous pavement, native landscaping, trees, bioswales, constructed wetlands, and soil enhancements. The discharge permit under which MMSD operates to meet the Clean Water Act requires implementing 50 million gallons of GI capacity to manage water where it falls to protect the region’s waterways and Lake Michigan. The project will span three years and result in several million gallons of new GI capacity. The work also includes 25% small, women, and minority-owned business goals and mentor-protege training. This program will also provide air quality/carbon sequestration benefits and overall quality of life enhancements.
